Applewood Community Church friends and family, I am Matt Granitto representing AWCC PrayerLine. Prayer requests and

prayer situation updates are forwarded to me by email, phone calls, written notes or in person. These heartfelt requests and updates are written up and sent out to all members of the PrayerLine mailing list - most of whom are AWCC family and friends - as a PUSH memo. PUSH stands for "Pray Until Something Happens". Special care is taken regarding confidentiality and sensitivity. The PrayerLine is not connected to AWCC's website. Email is only sent to the list member's address of choice. List members can unsubscribe at anytime. The mailing list will NOT be given to any outside party.

New Neighborhood Outreach

The Little Food Pantry is complete. The plan is to stock it with nonperishable food items that are contributed by members of our congregation. Please limit your donations to an item or two at a time so everyone will be able to participate, especially the children. Also, we don't have any place to store the excess. If the shelves are full the donors will have to save their item for another time.



New Benevolence Guidelines

If you are approached at church by someone in need or by someone making a request for monetary help for their physical need, here are some proposed guidelines:

- 1. No cash will be available on the premises.
- 2. Bags of necessities will be offered to those asking for help.
- 3. Directions to public restrooms in the area will be provided.
- 4. The individual will not be allowed past the foyer area unless 2 or more people are in the building and aware of his/her presence.
- 5. Resource materials will be provided listing shelters, food banks, and other assistance available in Jefferson County. The Action Center and Mean Street Ministries will be recommended and contact information given.
- 6. King Soopers gift cards in the amount of \$20 will be offered at the discretion of church staff (can be used for food, gas and bus tickets). Recipients will be allowed two gift cards per calendar year.
- Records will be kept including date of interaction, description of what was given and the recipient's name and signature (acknowledging guidelines and receipt of gift cards).
